

# Town of Waldoboro Recycling Guide



## THANK YOU

The Select Boards of Cushing, Friendship, and Waldoboro thank ALL permitted users for their efforts to recycle, whether they go to the Transfer Station themselves, or use the service of one of the waste haulers permitted to collect solid waste in the three towns.

## RECYCLING IS REQUIRED

The Transfer Station Operator may charge a \$.06 per estimated pound of uncompacted waste for permitted users who do not recycle.

## PLASTIC HDPE 1 - 7

Look on the container for the number in the chasing arrows symbol as shown here. Please rinse clean, remove caps and rings, and place in the dumpster to the left of the trash hopper. #2 Plastic is sorted with colored in one dumpster, and natural (milk jugs) in another, while 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 is in a different dumpster.

Recycle milk jugs, laundry detergent jugs, 5 gallon pails, fluff containers, some plant pots, or anything with the number 1-7 symbol (as shown here). **Not for plastic bags and oil containers.**



## PLASTIC BAGS

Clean and dry plastic grocery bags in the trash can to the left of the trash hopper. Recycle grocery bags like Shop 'n Save bags.



## RIGID PLASTICS

We also accept 'rigid' plastics that may not have the numbers 1 through 7 on them. These are plastics that bend, but do not break easily (**NOT BRITTLE**). An example would be some plastic children's toys. Brittle plastics are placed in the hopper.

## CARDBOARD

Corrugated cardboard is double-sided with a zigzag center. Boxes must be clean, dry, flattened, and put into the roller-bin across from the trash hopper.

Recycle paper bags and corrugated cardboard here. **Not for other types of boxes such as shoe boxes (they go with mixed paper).**



## GLASS

Please rinse glass clean, remove lids and rings, and place in the plastic bins to the left of the trash hopper. Recycle clear, green, and brown bottles and jars.

**Not for window panes, light bulbs, or Pyrex.**

## METALS

Make sure to check in with the attendant, then place these items on the metal pile. Recycle pots, pans, silverware, metal chairs, bicycles, metal signs, and lawn mowers drained of oil and gas.



## TIN

Please rinse tin clean and place in the plastic bins to the left of the trash hopper.

Recycle tin cans, tin lids from glass jars, clean aluminum foil, clean aluminum pie plates.

## MIXED PAPER

Clean, dry, crush, and place in the roller bin across from the trash hopper.

Recycle Shoe boxes, egg cartons, cereal boxes, junk mail, windowed and plain envelopes, Dixie cups, computer paper, paper towel rolls, colored paper, phone book covers.

**Not for plastic, carbon paper, foil, glitter, or ribbon.**

## MOTOR OIL

Make sure to check in with the attendant, then place these items in the designated area.

Recycle diesel fuel, engine oil, transmission oil, anti-freeze, paint, etc.



## CDD (Construction / Demolition Debris)

Make sure to check in with the attendant, then place these items in the appropriate area.

Use this area for asphalt shingles, tarpaper, roofing felt, bricks, broken concrete, chimney bricks, broken wallboard and sheet rock.

**Not for plastic sheathing, tarps, styrofoam, water pipe, sewer pipe, rope, hose, insulation, vinyl, or fiber glass goes in the hopper.** Painted wood, stained wood, pressure treated wood, plywood, OSB and particle board go in the wood pile.

## NEWSPAPERS / MAGAZINES

Newspapers must be loose (no strings, bags, or ties) and place in roller bin across from the trash hopper.

Recycle newspapers, magazines, advertisement fliers, and phone books.



**Not for hard cover books, boxes, or mixed paper.**



## BATTERIES

Make sure to check in with the attendant, then place these items in the designated area.

Recycle car batteries and rechargeable batteries.

## FEE SCHEDULE

If residents recycle, there is no fee for household trash.

Antifreeze (Gallon)..... \$1.00

Appliances :

- without refrigerant (each)..... \$3.00
- with refrigerant (each) .....\$10.00

Construction Debris (a permit is required for more than 4 cubic yards with a maximum of 30 cubic yards per month):

- less than 1 cubic yard (per cubic yd) .....\$10.00
- 1 to 4 cubic yards (per cubic yd).....\$15.00
- 4+ to 8 cubic yards (per cubic yd).....\$30.00
- 8+ cubic yards (per cubic yd) .....\$40.00

Light Ballasts (each) ..... \$1.25

Mattress /Box Spring / etc. (each) ..... \$5.00

Oil (Gallon) ..... \$0.50

Paint:

- Latex (mixed w/ sawdust or cat litter)..... Free
- Oil Based, 5 gal maximum (per gallon)..... \$8.00

Scrap Metal (per cubic yard)..... \$5.00

Televisions / CRT's (each) ..... \$5.00

Tires:

- Automobile, rims removed (each)..... \$2.00
- Truck, 20" or smaller, rims removed (each) ..... \$5.00

Wood:

- Brush (per cubic yard) ..... \$5.00
- Clean Demolition (per cubic yard).....\$15.00

## BRUSH / TREES

Make sure to check in with the attendant, then place these items on the brush pile. Recycle brush and trees.

**Not for painted, stained, plywood, pressure treated wood, an 2x4 all which go onto the wood pile.**

\*\*Stumps are not accepted at the transfer station.



## APPLIANCES

Make sure to check in with the attendant, then place these items in the appliance area. Recycle stoves, refrigerators, and other appliances



## WOOD PILE

Make sure to check in with the attendant, then place these items on the wood pile.

Please place plain, painted, stained, plywood, 2 x 4, all dimensional wood, and OSB.

\*\*Pressure treated wood has it's own pile.
